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ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT
(Domestic Nonprofit Corporation)

The undersigned hereby adopts the following amendment to its Articles of Incorporation pursuant to AS 10.20.181:

ARTICLE I (See Part 2 of instructions)

The name of the corporation is:

Mt. Marathon Association

ARTICLE II (See Part 3 of instructions)

The following amendment to the Articles of Incorporation was adopted on the 10th day of September, 19 93, by the members board of directors.

A. If adopted by the members, check one of the following:

There are members entitled to vote on the amendment; a quorum was present at the meeting and the amendment received at least two-thirds of the votes which members present at the meetings or represented by proxy were entitled to cast.

There are members entitled to vote on the amendment, and the amendment was adopted by a consent in writing signed by all members entitled to vote, with respect to the amendment.

RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

QUTEKCAK NATIVE TRIBE

We, the undersigned adult Native residents of the State of Alaska, for the purpose of updating our non-profit corporation pursuant to the laws of the State, do hereby make and subscribe the following Restated Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the corporation is Qutekcak Native Tribe.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

This organization is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Its objectives and purposes are:

1. To promote pride on the part of tribal members in their Alaska Native cultures and traditions.
2. To preserve the customs, folklore, and art of the Native races;
3. To promote the physical, economic, and social well-being of tribal members.

ARTICLE III

Profits and Prohibited Activities

This corporation is not organized for profit, and no dividends shall be declared or paid, nor shall it have the power to issue certification of stock, and no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any person or organization. The balance, if any, of all money received by the corporation from its operations, after payment in full of all debts and obligations of the corporation, shall be used and distributed exclusively for the purposes set forth in Article II of these Articles. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law), or (b) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

ARTICLE IV
Place of Business

The principle place of business of the corporation is Seward, Alaska, and its registered address is P.O. Box 1467 Seward, Alaska 99664.

ARTICLE V
Registered Agent

The registered agent of the corporation shall be Kenneth E. Blatchford, whose address shall be P.O. Box 1467, Seward, Alaska 99664.

ARTICLE VI
Period of Duration

The period of duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VII
Membership

There shall be three classes of membership: Base Roll members, Adopted members, and Automatic members.

1. Base Roll members are those Alaska Native residents of the Seward Area who are at least 1/4 (one quarter) blood quantum, and who organized the Mount Marathon tribal group in 1973, which was the first modern-day successor to the original Qutekcak Village tribe.
2. Adopted members are those Alaska Natives who are at least 1/4 (one quarter) blood quantum, age 18 years or older, who have resided in the Seward Area for at least three years prior to their application for membership, and who have provided documentation that the sentence for any prior felony conviction has been completed at least three years prior to their application for membership.
3. Automatic members are the lineal descendants of base enrollees and adoptees, provided that the applicant has provided written proof that he or she is a lineal descendant. Members who have reached their 18th birthday and who have resided in the Seward area for at least 30 days prior to an election, shall be eligible to vote in such election.

ARTICLE VIII
Indebtedness

The highest amount of indebtedness of liability to which the corporation may be subject at any time is \$500,000.00.

ARTICLE IX
Board of Directors

The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by the board of directors which shall be called the Qutekcak Tribal Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council), which shall consist of seven (7) members, who shall be elected by a majority vote of the members of the Qutekcak Native Tribe present and voting at their annual election, pursuant to the Constitution of the Qutekcak Native Tribe.

ARTICLE X
By-Laws

The Constitution of the Qutekcak Native Tribe shall serve as the corporate by-laws. The Constitution may be altered, amended, or revoked only upon the approval of the Council, and upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Qutekcak Native Tribe present and voting at a duly convened meeting and in accordance with other restrictions set forth in the Constitution.

ARTICLE XI
Amendment to Articles of Incorporation

These articles of incorporation may be amended at any regular meeting of the members of the corporation, or at any special meeting of the same called for the purpose, by a vote of two-thirds of eligible voting members present or represented at the meeting. No Amendment of the Articles of Incorporation shall be made at any regular meeting or special meeting unless a notice is mailed to each member at his or her last address of record at least thirty (30) days prior to such meeting, stating that it is proposed that the Articles be amended at such regular or special meeting and setting forth the text of the proposed changes.

ARTICLE XII
Definitions

As used herein, a Native means a citizen of the United States who is a person of one-fourth degree or more Alaska Indian, Eskimo or Aleut blood, or combination thereof. The term includes any Native as so defined either or both of whose adoptive parents are not Natives. It also includes, in the absence of proof of a minimum blood quantum, any citizen of the United States who is regarded as an Alaska Native by the Native village or Native group of which he claims to be a member and whose father or mother is (or, if deceased, was) regarded as Native by such village or group.

ARTICLE XIII
Distribution of Assets

Upon the dissolution of this corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future tax code), or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
